

Kitakyushu Monorail



Anime and Manga Landmarks

Manga Museum

Another must-visit spot is the Kitakyushu Manga Museum, which celebrates the city's ties to famous manga artists like Leiji Matsumoto, Seizo Watase, Jun Hatanaka and Tsukasa Hojo. The museum showcases a vast collection of valuable works and materials, offering a deeper look into the world of Japanese comics. It's also home to a library of around 70,000 manga volumes, which visitors can freely read.

Okada Shrine

Explore Kitakyushu's rich manga and anime culture with a visit to Okada Shrine. It's an ancient sacred space, mentioned in Japan's oldest book, the Kojiki, and it enshrines Emperor Jimmu, the legendary progenitor of the Imperial family. Fans of Demon Slayer: Kimetsu no Yaiba will be drawn to a statue of Yatagarasu — a mythical three-legged crow — which stands on the grounds. Guests can also participate in wearing traditional Shinto shrine maiden attire, which will delight fans of Your Name.

English-speaking staff are available. This shrine also holds the top spot in Fukuoka prefecture's popular goshiun (seal book) rankings, attracting visitors from all over the country.

Mount Sarakura

Later, head to Mount Sarakura for one of Japan's best night views. The mountain is filled with rich nature, yet still close to the city center, providing a stunning vantage point to visitors. The view from the peak is spectacular; additionally, the harvest moon viewed from Mount Sarakura is certified as one of the 100 Most Famous Moons of Japan. Easily accessible by slope and cable car, the breathtaking panorama of the city lights is an unforgettable experience.

Kokura Castle

Explore some of Kitakyushu's most iconic sights, starting with Kokura Castle, with its impressive castle tower which was rebuilt in 1959. Visitors can enjoy the café, which is open daily, or take part part in regular dinner and bar events, where you can dine and drink within the castle grounds, which are spectacularly illuminated at night.

Enjoy a high-definition, large-screen theater on the first fl oor, and exhibitions related to the history of the castle and the region throughout, with displays of samurai armor, swords and other culturally significant artifacts. On the fifth floor, an observatory allows for panoramic views of the city.

Exploring the Karst Plateau and Local Delights









Brasserie Soma

After exploring nature, head to Brasserie Soma, a café and bar located in Tanga Market. Enjoy local specialties such as Kokura beef, which is famous for its vivid coloring and delicate marbling, plus delicious regional craft beer. Reservations are recommended.

Hiraodai

Experience Kitakyushu's natural wonders with a visit to Hiraodai, which contains one of Japan's top three karst plateaus.

This site offers a unique opportunity for trekking and caving on the "Piece of Earth Hiraodai" tour, as the only place in Kyushu where visitors can experience authentic cave exploration. The limestone formations scattered throughout the area are a fantastical, otherworldly sight, making for incredible sightseeing as you trek through the winding trails on the park grounds.
